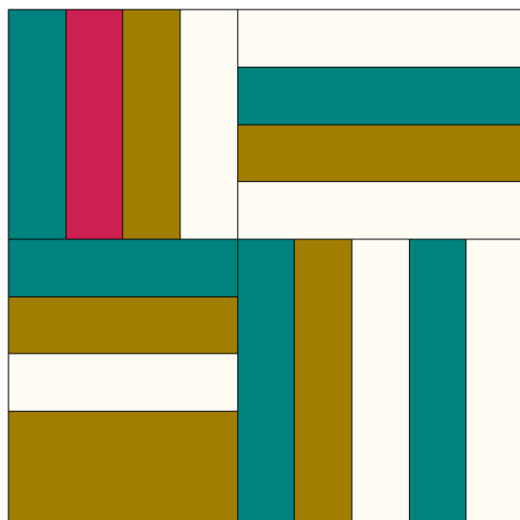

Fabric 1  background
Cut (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (D)
Cut (4) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " (F)

Fabric 2 
Cut (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (A)
Cut (3) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " (G)

Fabric 3 
Cut (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (C)
Cut (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " (H)
Cut (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (E)

Fabric 4 
Cut (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (B)

General Pattern Notes

1. The block will measure $9\frac{1}{2}$ " (9" finished in the quilt top).
2. Sew all seams with a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam allowance, unless otherwise noted.

Use of Directional Fabrics

The instructions for the Intersection block were written for non-directional prints. If you choose to use directional prints for any of the fabrics, you may need to alter the cutting instructions to maintain the directionality of the fabric(s) within the block.

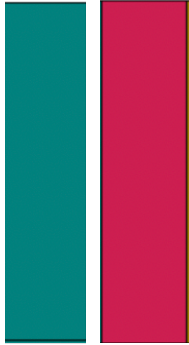
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Block Construction

Step 1: Create Unit 1

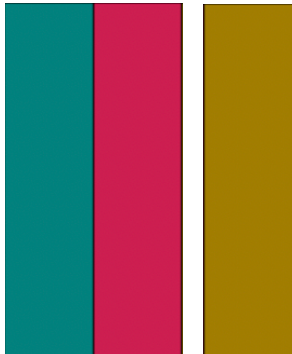
Sew A to B

Press Seam towards A



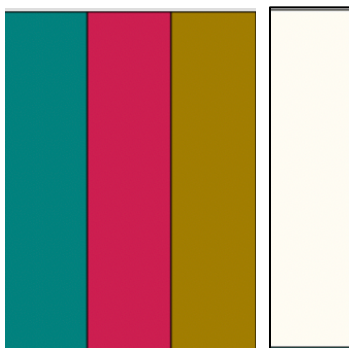
Sew C to AB

Press Seam towards C



Sew D to ABC

Press Seam towards D



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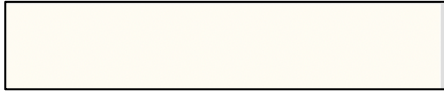
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Step 2: Create Unit 2

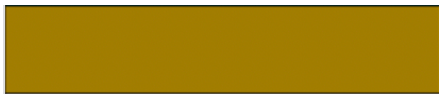
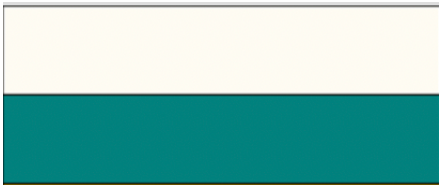
Sew A to C

Press Seam towards A



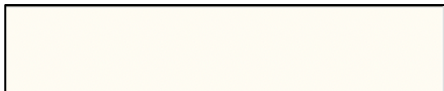
Sew D to AC

Press Seam towards D



Sew E to ACD

Press Seam towards E



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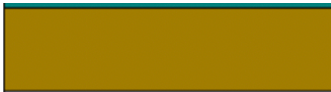
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Step 3 Create Unit 3

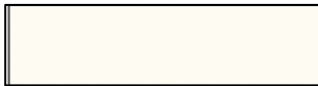
Sew F to G

Press Seam towards F



Sew H to FG

Press Seam towards H



Sew F to FGH

Press Seam towards F



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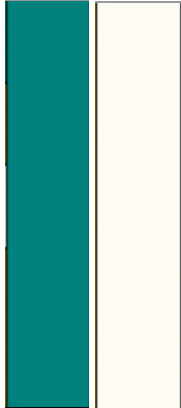
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Step 4: Create Unit 4

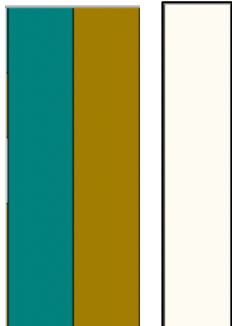
Sew G to H

Press Seam towards G



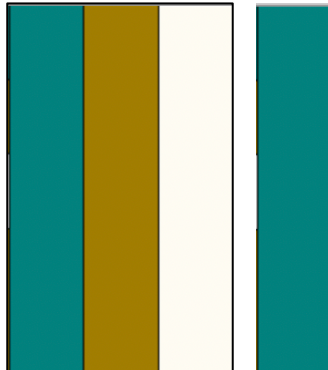
Sew F to GH

Press Seam towards G



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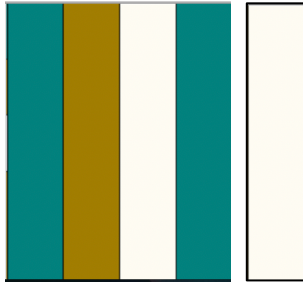
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Sew F to GHFH

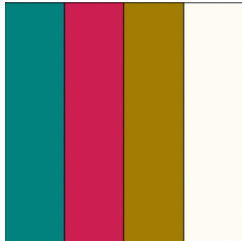
Press Seam towards F

Press seam towards Unit 2



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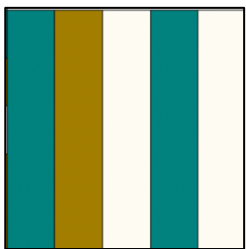
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Step 6:

Press seam towards Unit 3

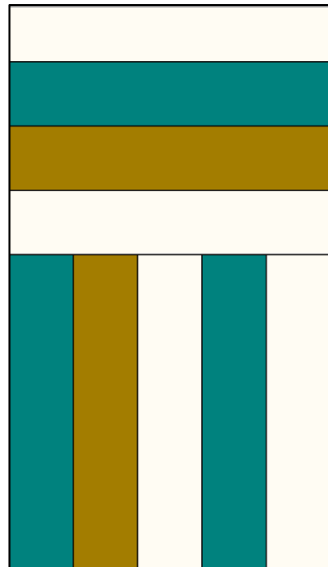


Step 7:

Sew the combined Unit (1-2) to the combined Unit (3-4)

Press the top seam towards Unit 1

Press the bottom seam towards Unit 4



Final Block

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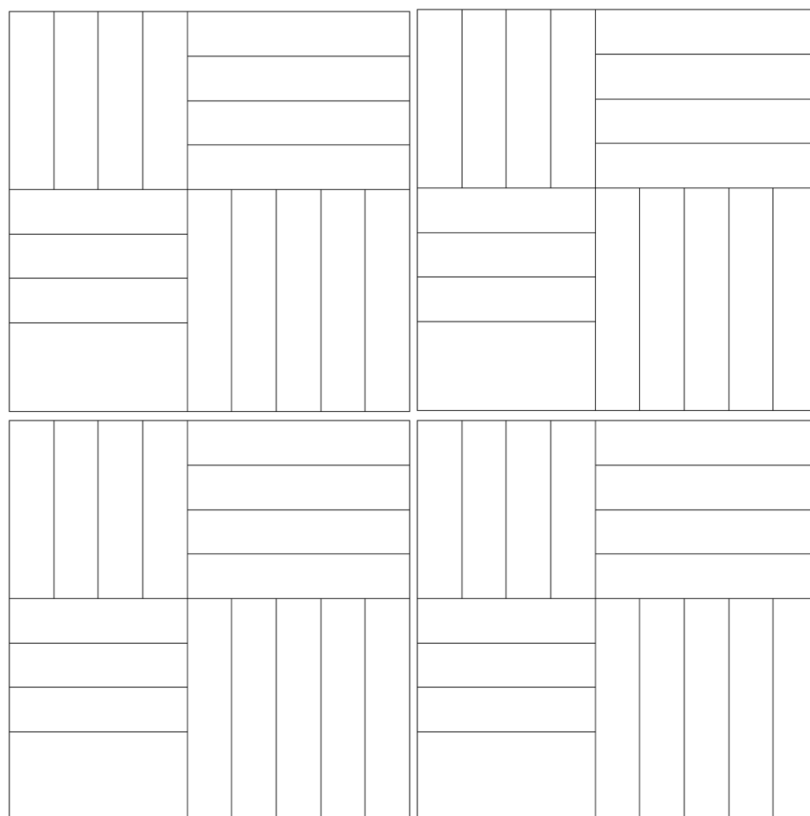
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The block will measure 9 ½" (9" finished in the quilt top).
